1. Carefully state the definition of "polynomial space in $s$ ". Give a set of two vectors, drawn from $P_{1}(s)$.
2. Let $u=\left[\begin{array}{c}217-1\end{array}\right]$. For each of the following, specify what type of object $v$ must be for the expression to be defined. If the expression can never be defined, write NONE.
SAMPLE QUESTION: $u+v$. This has three answers, any one of which is correct: SAMPLE ANSWER: (1) row 3 -vector; or (2) row vector from $\mathbb{R}^{3}$; or (3) $1 \times 3$ matrix.
3. $u^{T} v+u v^{T}$
4. $u \cdot v$
5. $u \times v$
6. $(u \cdot v) \times u$
7. $u \cdot(v \times u)$
8. Let $A=\left(\begin{array}{ll}1 & 0 \\ 2 & 1\end{array}\right), B=\left(\begin{array}{ll}1 & 2 \\ 3 & 4\end{array}\right)$. Compute $A B A^{T}$.
9. Let $u=(1,0,-1), v=(0,2,3)$. Calculate $u \times v$.
10. Let $u=(1,2,3), v=(x, y, 0)$. Find values for $x, y$ such that $u, v$ are orthogonal and also simultaneously $\|v\|=1$.
